



Waterford Libraries are delighted to offer the following equipment for loan.








Terms and Condtions

- You will receive a message when your item is ready for collection from your branch. Pop in and pick it up.

Doorbell House




Wooden Sorting Box. Matching and Sorting activity.





Lacing Shoes.






Handwriting Angled Board

Players solve the puzzles by placing path pieces on the board to connect animals and objects according to challenges selected in the included booklet. Logic and Problem Solving.




Magnetic Mazes

Forever Up and Down


Move the infinite track round and round but keep the ball on the track. Gross Motor, Visual Perception Eye Tracking & Coordination.

This wooden balancing board is a fun way to train balance, body tension and agility. The oval shape provides a wide standing surface and the two paws indicate the correct foot position.




Scooter Board

Recommended weight: max. 45 kg - 100 lbs




Spinning Sitzl

Recommended weight: max. 120 kg



River Stones



Wiggle Seat


The Wiggle Seat enables kids to focus and stay calm as it is an outlet for excess energy in the classroom, during meals, and at homework time. Pump included.



Movin' Sit





Balancing Board





Use under adult supervision.




Wiggle Seat Large

Learn About Feelings Activity Set



Avalanche Fruit Stand



FantaCOLOR Junior


This educational toy is great to encourage your child's creative skills, hand-eye coordination, and to develop their fine motor skills and hand dexterity.






Nuts and Bolts Set

Sorting Pie


Teaches key early numeracy skills as children sort the fruit counters by their attributes. Jumbo tweezers for motor skills. 3+

Use the coloured coin counters with different functions on the owl, helping children learn strength, hand-eye coordination, grip and scissor skills.



The small balls have differently textured surfaces and can be removed and used separately. Age 6 months plus.




Teaching Tac-Tiles







Small Wooden bench with coloured be and mallet. For auditory and visual senses.




Octopus Fidget lap pad.

For sensory exploration and calming.








Light Sensory Kit

This fabric BusyBoard offers more than 10 closures, laces, buttons and clasps and many hidden surprises. Portable.








Tactile Tiles


Double sided cardboard tiles with animal pictures and skin textures.

Rattles, Rainmakers and a Poppity. To explore different sounds.




Cuddle Ball

The Smartest Giant in Town.




Push Pull Slide Version of the Smartest giant in Town with finger puppets of the characters for an interactive experience.
